1 High Line Hotel

Location Occupies a slice of the 1895 Gothic-style General Theological Seminary, in Chelsea. **Ideal for** High Line explorers; gallery-hoppers. **Nod to the Past** Original stained-glass windows; well-worn handwoven carpets. **What We Love** A desktop stationery embosser to personalize postcards and envelopes. **Choice Bite** Cult bakery Mah Ze Dahr's caramel-oatmeal bars, served from the hotel's 1963 Citroën van parked by the entrance. **Smallest Room** 275 square feet. **Details** 180 10th Ave.; thehighlinehotel.com. \$\$\$



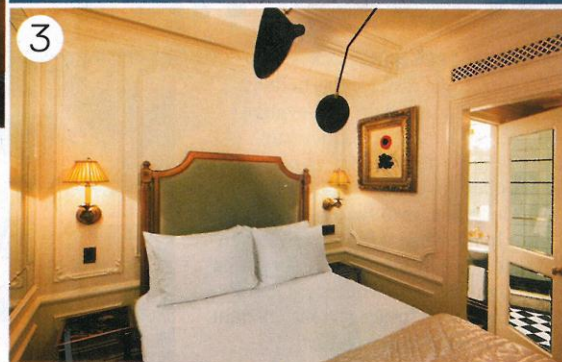
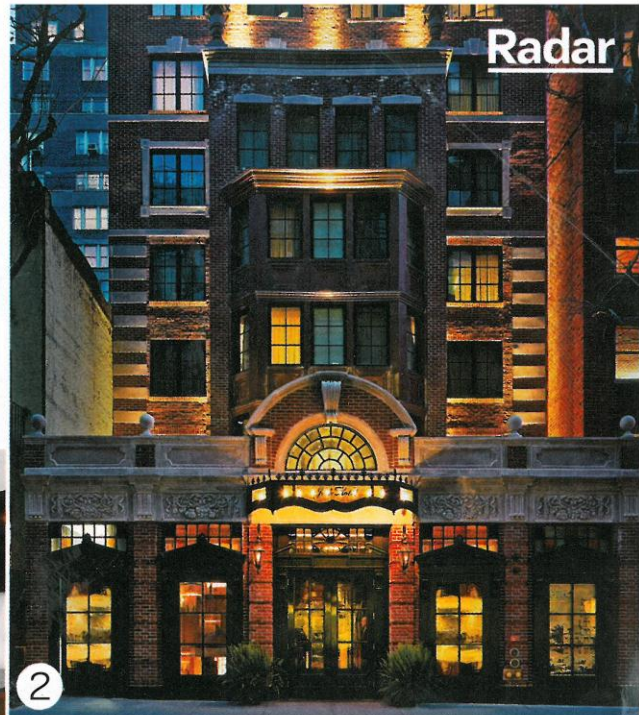

2 Jade Hotel

Location Brick-clad building on a prime Greenwich Village block, equidistant from the Village Vanguard, Bleecker Street, and Washington Square. **Ideal for** Music nostalgics; visiting NYU parents. **Nod to the Past** Vintage photos of the Rolling Stones and Andy Warhol; old-school rotary phones. **What We Love** A library of art books, curated by *Maker* magazine, beside the lobby fireplace. **Choice Bite** Cocoa-

3 The Marlton Hotel

Location Notorious Greenwich Village flophouse—Jack Kerouac and Lenny Bruce were guests—redone by hip hotelier Sean MacPherson. **Ideal for** Stylists with a tight budget (and not much luggage: rooms are tiny). **Nod to the Past** Weathered marble floors in the lobby; ornate moldings in guest rooms. **What We Love** Lighting fixtures inspired by 1920's designer Serge Mouille. **Choice Bite** Croissants and café au lait at Parisian-style Café Marlton. **Smallest Room** 100 square feet. **Details** 5 W. 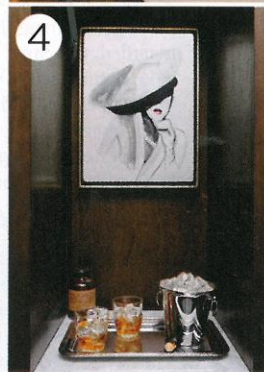

4 Refinery Hotel

Location The 1912 edifice in the Fashion District once housed hat factories on its top floors and a ladies-who-lunch tearoom in the lobby. **Ideal for** Fashion execs; seekers of non-touristy midtown zones. **Nod to the Past** Wooden



writing desks designed to look like old sewing machine tables. **What We Love** Cocktails conceived by a molecular biologist and former NASA consultant. **Choice Bite** Lamb burger with goat cheese and harissa aioli at Parker & Quinn.

5 Viceroy New York

Location New build in Midtown West, down the block from Carnegie Hall, with a retro design by heritage-chic specialists Roman & Williams. **Ideal for** Trend-conscious business travelers. **Nod to the Past** Black and white tiles with scarlet grouting; multipaned windows; brass hardware. **What We Love** A rooftop bar by Rande Gerber with expansive views of Central Park. **Choice Bite** Roasted scallops with *ganciale* at chef Marc Murphy's Kingside restaurant. **Smallest Room** 250 square feet. **Details** 120 W. 57th St.; viceroyhotelsandresorts.com. \$\$\$ —RACHEL FELDER
